

Context:

For the academic year 2017-18, Wallscourt Farm Academy will be eligible for an allocation of Sports Premium as detailed below. This funding is to improve the provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport in Primary Schools. The funding is provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

Requirements:

Maintained schools and academies must publish, on their website, information about their use of the PE and Sport Grant allocation by 4 April 2014 and thereafter. Schools should publish the amount of grant received; how it has been spent (or will be spent) and what impact the school has seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment as a result, to help to ensure that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

Wallscourt Farm:

At Wallscourt Farm we have a clear vision for learning, and this includes supporting all children to engage in a rich learning experience within and beyond school. We have a clear sense of Equity and Excellence, and ensure access for all. We are committed to supporting all children to make choices to ensure they engage in positive life choices.

In order to leave a sustainable legacy we plan to use the sports premium to enable us to meet the following outcomes:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- Raising the profile of PE, Sport and physical activity across the Academy as a tool for whole school improvement and engagement in our 21 century learning skills.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all teaching staff
- Broader experience in a range of physical activities offered to pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport in an age appropriate, progressive way

Impact measurement:

The impact of the Sports Premium Spending will be included within the Monitoring and Evaluating cycle for the Academy and our Academy Improvement Plan and SEF. Review of the provision and spend as detailed above will be included in the review. Scrutinising the impact will be the Academy Council, SLT using a range of self-evaluation strategies, including self and peer review, provision mapping, reflection and review, data analysis including engagement of all pupils and CPD evaluation.

During the academic year, Wallscourt Farm Academy worked with Future Stars Coaching Ltd to revolutionise sport delivery.

Sports participation at Wallscourt Farm will be so much more than just PE lessons, with every child in the school having the opportunity, resources and guidance to be the very best they can be.

Fundamentally, selected in curricular PE lessons will be supported by two fully qualified sports coaches. The ratio will not only allow fantastic quality of delivery, but will also allow the existing school teachers to become actively involved in each session. The approach will see improved teacher/pupil monitoring & assessment as well 'continuous professional development' opportunities for the teacher. This will ensure pupils become physically literate enabling them to access a lifelong participation in physical activity.

Also, a wide variety of after school & lunch time sports clubs will be available to the children throughout the academic year.

Future Stars Coaching Clubs aren't only coaching sessions... Through 'club links' (local rugby, netball, football, gymnastics clubs, etc) children can be offered an accessible pathway in order to develop outside of the Future Stars Clubs. Through the Future Stars Clubs children are also offered opportunities to participate in professional match day experiences. The school, teachers, children, parents and the sports coaches will all work together in order to maximise the potential of every participant to be the best they can be.

The relationship between the school and it's sporting partners has been created to ensure a sustainable legacy for the children, school & local area; and will also allow collaboration opportunities with other schools through tournaments, competitions and festivals.
